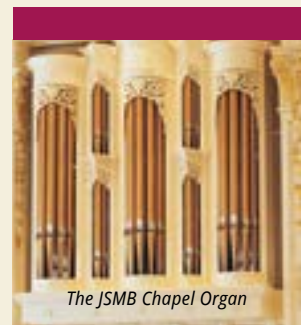

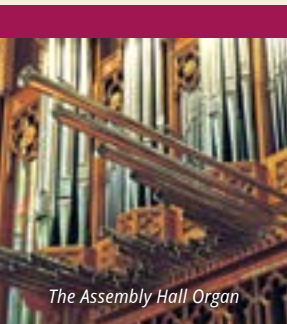

110th Anniversary of Choir Recordings

On September 1, 1910, the first recording of The Tabernacle Choir was made, using two large horns to capture the sound of the Choir. The 110th anniversary of the first recording was celebrated this year with a press event highlighting the many recording accomplishments of the Choir over the last century.
